

ADDENDUM

GUILBERT E. 2012: Phylogeny of Cantacaderinae (Heteroptera: Tingidae) revisited after the description of a new genus and new species from New Caledonia. *Eur. J. Entomol.* **109**(1): 111–116.

Caledoderus monteithi was recently described as a new genus and species by Guilbert (2012). Article 16.4.2 of ICZN (1999) requires a statement of intent that the holotype is deposited in a collection and a statement indicating the name and location of that collection. Unfortunately, it is unclear if this requirement was satisfied. The nearest thing to such a statement was in the Acknowledgements section, where it was stated that “the author is grateful to G. Monteith (Queensland Museum) for the loan of numerous specimens of Tingidae from New Caledonia, including the new genus and species described in this paper”. Assuming that the above requirement is not satisfied by this statement, the species name is not available, and neither is the genus name because Art. 13.3 requires the fixation of a type species which must itself be an available name. The terms of the collecting permit in New Caledonia require holotype deposition in the Museum National d’Histoire Naturelle, Paris, France.

Therefore, in order to remove any uncertainty about validity of the above names, they are herein validated with the same author and year (even if not date) of publication as follows:

***Caledoderus* gen. n.**

Type species: *Caledoderus monteithi* sp. n. (herein designated).

Description: See Guilbert, 2012.

Etymology: See Guilbert, 2012. Gender masculine.

***Caledoderus monteithi* sp. n.**

Description: See Guilbert, 2012.

Holotype: Same specimen as invalidly designated by Guilbert, 2012 (herein designated). Deposited in Museum National d’Histoire Naturelle, Paris, France.
